





Community Engagement

Engagement Approach The 95th Street Corridor community engagement activities were grounded in the International Association for Public Participation (IAP2) Spectrum of Public Participation. Acknowledging that people engage at different levels, the intention of the engagement process was to promote increased levels of participation. and shared decision authority. Outreach activities were developed to inform community members, and to gradually move their participation along the spectrum towards consultation, involvement, and collaboration with the intent to build comfort with and understanding of the topics, questions, and proposals - and ultimately build trust and capacity in the community. The project team put efforts in meeting community where they are and respecting how much time each resident can provide to get involved in the planning process, recognizing that this looks different for everyone.
